Steps to Modeling Steam


- DO YOUR RESEARCH!!!

- Focus until it's finished



























Choose Your Prototype

 - Scrapped December 1959 at Purdy SSF

 - Delivered June 1942 with Timken Roller Bearings
 - Vacated May 1958
 - Scrapped October 1958 at CA Metals Pittsburg
