

The Central Pacific arrived in the area in early 1868 with the construction of the transcontinental railroad, and the first scheduled train from Sacramento arrived a few months later. Sparks was born in 1905 when the division point was moved from Wadsworth, and the new town was named after the Governor of Nevada.

At an elevation of 4,413 feet (1,345 meters), days can be warm and nights can be cool. Stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water. Nearby Victoria Square has a several restaurants and bars.

Who Ordered These Engines to Run Backward?

The unique cab forward was a hallmark of Southern Pacific steam power. But the derailment of the Overland Limited near Applegate, California in February 1912, while hauled by cab forward #4208, caused SP President William Sproule to question the wisdom of his officers in adopting such an unusual locomotive design. The resulting investigation determined the cause of the derailment and brought out many details of how the cab forward design was originally developed.

SP Retired Employees "Old Timers Talk"


Former railroad employees of the SP are invited to tell true stories and tall-tales about working on the railroad.

Sacramento to Sparks, 1976-1996: The Final Years

A photographic journey from Sacramento, California to Sparks, Nevada across famed Donner Pass on Southern Pacific's mainline. For this presentation we will focus on the final 20 years of the Southern Pacific from 1976 to 1996. Aside from the freight action, we will also see Amtrak's *California Zephyr*, the *Reno Fun Train* and even the shortlive Transcisco Tours *Sierra 49er Express*.

Somewhat Unique Southern Pacific Narrow-gauge Freight Cars and Structures

This clinic discusses the acquisition by the Southern Pacific in 1900, of a 300-mile narrow-gauge line, from just East of Carson City, NV, to Keeler, CA, in the Owens Valley East of the Sierra Nevada mountains. Once purchased, and gold & silver was found in the immediate area, the SP found the need to create custom train cars and facilities to transport the ore for processing. The clinic is entirely discussion of slides of original B/W photos and pictures from Steve Bradley's award-winning layout, structures and train cars.

Modoc Memories in Color

Following the collapse of the narrow-gauge Nevada-California-Oregon Railway in 1925, Southern Pacific acquired the company for standard gauging its right of way to complete a shortcut for the newly activated Natron Cutoff at Klamath Falls, Oregon to the SP's Overland Route at Fernley, Nevada. Once completed in 1928, the "Modoc Line" combined the former N-C-O with SP's Fernley and Lassen Railway at Wendel to form this gateway. This presentation will feature images from the era of color photography sharing SP's articulated steam power, high horsepower freight drags, passenger excursions, facilities, and the two branches that fed local traffic.

Southern Pacific diesels working for connecting railroads in places where they were not expected to be seen. No images in Taylor Yard, West Colton, Dolores, etc...




