SP 1673 sits at the Tucson Depot March 20, 1955, to recognize 75 years of service to Tucson.



Southern Pacific arrived in the area on March 20, 1880, and continued east towards its ultimate goal of reaching New Orleans. For Southern Pacific historians, Tucson was a division point with a large depot and yard served by locomotives of all types. Smaller locomotives worked the local branches while the larger locomotives worked the railroad in all directions including south to Nogales, Douglas, Bisbee. At some point in time almost all the classes of road locomotive power would run to Tucson, both coal and oil. Tucson hosted both the El Paso & Southwestern Railroad along with the SP.


Model Contest Rules: The entrant detailed and painted the model, any scale.

Locomotives of the EP&SW

Today's presentation provides an overview of the locomotives of the El Paso & Southwestern Railroad, a business venture established by Arizona mining interests in the late 1800s. By 1913, the EP&SW had extended its railroad lines from Tucumcari, New Mexico, through El Paso and Bisbee to Tucson, Arizona. Allied with the Rock Island, the EP&SW eventually became part of a Los Angeles-to-Chicago route known in modern times as the "Golden State Route." It was viewed as a competitive threat by the Southern Pacific and was bought out by the SP in 1924. About 150 coal-fired steam locomotives were included in the transaction, eventually integrated into the rosters of the SP and the SP of Mexico.

1950's Sunset Limited (Encore Presentation)

This will be giving an "encore" presentation on the 1950 streamlined Sunset Limited, first presented at the 2004 Tempe, AZ SPH&TS convention. The presentation was originally developed from work on what was initially intended as a 50-year anniversary tribute on the train for a 2000 edition of Trainline but continued to grow in size and scope as more and more information was uncovered, to the point where it was realized that it would take more than the magazine to cover the subject. The decision eventually was made to develop an entire book on the full history of the train from inception to Amtrak, which the Society published in 2006, co-authored by myself, Dennis Ryan and John Signor. This presentation covers the development and description of equipment and introduction of the 1950 lightweight train. After 21 years it felt a new audience might enjoy the story and I am pleased and proud to present it again.

In November 1985, Southern California railfans Bill Farmer, Larry Jennings and Albert Novak headed to southern Arizona to photograph the Southern Pacific. This show has everything, including main line action, branch line trains, depots, the Phelps Dodge operation at Clifton and the Kennecott operation in Hayden before the formation of the Copper Basin Railway. This show features the best images from the trio's nine-day adventure.

Modeling the EP&SW Coal Tenders

A presentation on the multiple versions of the EP&SW and SP tenders used in and out the El Paso area. John will show some techniques that he has used modifying brass tenders for the more common locomotive power.

Ron Mei and Friends Lighting for Layouts

Ron and his group of friends present a very informative clinic on lighting for layouts. Ideas and concepts and stories learned when building the best Sunset Route layout in Arizona.

Mark Schwartz (Lt Col, USAF, Ret.) American Railroads & Logistics in WWII, and the Southern Pacific Railroad

American entry into World War II came during a transition from economic depression to full-capacity manufacturing. Soldiers, raw materials and war goods transversed the country and moved to departure ports — mostly on US rails. The Southern Pacific rose to this need and merited close government attention as a critical segment in the wartime rail system. SP beat the expectations and serviced military, and commercial transportation needs to help assure victory and America's expansion to global superpower.

David Hollywood Why "O" Scale?

Formally known as the "King of scales", O scale has the added reputation of "if you want it, you must build it". You'll also need a large space in which to build your layout if you want more than a switching shelf.

With that in mind, having neither the time for the former nor achieving the latter, I spent 20 years modeling "N" scale. But something was missing. As I aged, detail on my N scale empire began to go missing as well.

The opportunity arose to realize my number one on the railroad modeling bucket-list: "O scale". This occurred 20 years ago when the space for an O scale layout was possible. The building went up, the N scale collection was selling nicely, and the hunt for O scale equipment was on. This presentation attempts to take the audience on my journey of creating an O scale layout in a 1680 sq. ft room.

Steve Hegawood Painting SP Locomotives


